

## SPRING INTO ACTION SAFELY WITH YOUR PETS

#### Our top tips for keeping your pets safe

With the warmer weather and longer days just around the corner, it's a timely reminder to check your house and garden for anything that may be harmful to your furry friends before spring has sprung. Our curious companions can't help themselves to lick, sniff and chew their way into mischief, so here are our top 4 things to look out for...

**Poisonous baits:** You might be trying to get rid of slugs, snails and/or rats, but these baits are also dangerous to your pets. Keep the use of these to a minimum and ensure they are stored in a pet-proof container out of reach.

**Fertiliser:** Make sure you use a fertiliser that is free of toxins and when you are using this out in the garden, best to keep your pets inside.

**Poisonous plants:** As spring arrives, so do new plants in the gardens. Keep a close eye out on any new weeds or plants popping up in your garden as many are toxic to pets, or while out on your walks. These include daffodils, jonquils, tulips, hyacinths, iris, bluebells, crocus, amaryllis, gladiola, alliums, and lilies.

**Spring time allergies:** skin irritations, red sores, hair loss, watery eyes. Check your pet's paws, give them a bath and groom regularly to help get rid of pollen, dust, spores and seeds. Keep pet beds clean and vacuum carpets too.
